FOCUS

The central concern of Advaita Vedānta of Sri Śankara as commented in Brahmasutra Bhāṣya is "all Vedānta is directed towards establishing the doctrine of Oneness and integrity of Self (atmaikatva)" through dispelling off Avidyā. If Avidyā is infinite/ indescribable having its locus in the Ultimate Reality can it be claimed that cognition results in knowledge of Ultimate Reality even while Avidyā is having its locus in Brahman? Also, Chāndogya Upaniṣad III. 12.6 says 'one foot of him are all things, his three feet are immortal in heaven'. Does this imply that cognition results in the entire knowledge of Brahman or does it imply something else?

SOME COSMIC TRUTHS

Does there exist any absolute principle or reality?

- ★ The Advaita Vedānta categorically accepts an absolute entity without a second, not monistic. The Science accepts the truth that from Singularity the multiplicity comes into existence.
